(iii)	<i>NREGS : Clarification regarding the specific role of Zila Parishad as an implementing agency for NREGS may be furnished by the Ministry of Rural Development within 15 days to enable proper implementation of NREGS.</i>	<i>M/o Rural Development, Govt. of India</i>	M/o RD has clarified that minimum 50% NREGS funds have to be allocated to the Panchayats. The State cabinet has decided to allocate 25% (out of the balance 50%) to the Zilla Parishads. A writ petition is pending in the court challenging this decision.	<p>M/o RD: M/RD vide OM dated the 19th October 2009, have informed that Panchayats at district, intermediate and village levels shall be the principle authorities for planning and implementation of the schemes made under this Act. 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(iv)	<i>Promotion of Horticulture : Setting up of a cold storage unit of appropriate capacity would provide a boost to the horticulture sector. Ministry of Food Processing & APEDA to depute a Team to finalise the feasibility of the project within one month. Depending on the feasibility study, action would be taken up within three months.</i>	<i>: M/o Agriculture, National Horticulture Board and State Govt.</i>	The Central Team Visited the vegetable growing areas of Bishnupur district and survey has been conducted on 2 nd October, 2009 with the technical staff of the State Department of Horticulture. (vi)	<i>Banking Services : The banks are not willing to extend loans to beneficiaries for setting up small enterprises. The problem was particularly acute in case of the PMRY scheme. Applications for loans were returned/rejected without assigning any written reasons. Deptt of Banking/RBI to issue necessary instructions the banks, particularly to SBI, UBI and UCO Bank to ensure full release. In addition, it would be advised to increase the target under the ongoing PMEGP to compensate for under-achievement of target under the earlier PMRY scheme.</i>	<i>Deptt of Banking, Govt. of India, M/o Small and Medium Enterprises</i>	Banks are processing proposals sponsored under PMEGP within reasonable time.. (vii)	<i>Installation of ATMs by banks : Banks to set up ATMs in the district. To start with, the ATMs be set up in the Police Stations at Bishnupur, Nambol and Moirang and at places like the INA Memorial that already have dedicated security cover. 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(viii)	<u>Drinking Water</u> : Sixteen new habitations would be taken up this year under ARWSP. In addition, a request would be made to Secretary-Drinking Water Supply, Gol for deputing a technical team to assess & consider rehabilitation of all the ongoing as well as non-functional water supply projects for ensuring supply of safe drinking water. (ix)	<u>Fishery Sector</u> : The district administration would suggest an appropriate location and submit a DPR, within one month, for establishing a fish market.
